

That, Was Horse Training

Jerkens, Stephens, Whittingham, the last of the great horse trainers



Prove Out defeats Secretariat in the 1973 Woodward Stakes for trainer H. Allen Jerkens

What makes a great horse trainer?

I asked the late Hall of Famer <u>H. Allen Jerkens</u> that question once and he thought for a bit before answering... "Imagination."

That was an extremely short summary of a seven-decade career that saw him post <u>more upsets in major races</u> than any other trainer in the history of the sport, which earned him the nickname the "Giant Killer."

Jerkens was one of the last of the great horse trainers that dominated the sport in the '70s and 80's along with <u>Woody Stephens</u> on the east coast and <u>Charlie Whittingham</u> on the west coast.

Jerkens took ordinary horses and turned them into monsters like Prove Out and Onion. A former allowance sprinter, <u>Prove Out beat Triple Crown winner Secretariat in the 1973 Woodward Stakes</u>, and then defeated 1972 Kentucky Derby winner Riva Ridge in the <u>1973 Jockey Club Gold Cup</u>. Jerkens was chided in the press about Prove Out's workout schedule before the Gold Cup, as described by Steve Haskin at Secretariat.com below.

"For the two-mile Jockey Club Gold Cup, Jerkens breezed Prove Out a pair of slow miles, then breezed him three furlongs in :39 the Sunday before the race," wrote Haskin in <u>How Allen Jerkens Beat Secretariat Twice</u>. "The following morning, Prove Out worked a mile and a half in 2:39 3/5 with a final half in :49 1/5. Three days later, on the Thursday before the race, he galloped a mile and a half, after which he broke off into a dead run for a half-mile, which was timed in :47 2/5. He then galloped out an additional furlong in :12 3/5. There certainly was never anything conventional about Allen Jerkens.

"With all this bottom and sharpness in him, Prove Out went head and head with Riva Ridge in the Gold Cup through a seemingly suicidal half in :47 2/5. After six furlongs, Riva Ridge was spent, but Prove Out kept right on going."

Prove Out bounced off the rail in the stretch and drew out to win by about six lengths while Riva Ridge was beaten 33 lengths.


That, was horse training.



Woody Stephens wins five straight Belmont Stakes - Part 1 (1982,1983)

The same could be said for Woody Stephens' accomplishments. Stephens won <u>five Belmont Stakes in a row from 1982-1986</u> with Conquistador Cielo, Caveat, Swale, Creme Fraiche, and Danzig Connection (<u>Part 2 here</u>). How do you win the 1 ½-mile Belmont Stakes five years in a row against the best 3-year-olds in the country? It's not possible.

Whittingham won 252 stakes in California during his career and became the all-time leading trainer at both Hollywood Park Racetrack and Santa Anita Park. He won three Eclipse Awards, led the North American earnings list seven times and trained five Hall of Fame members including Ack Ack, Cougar II, Dahlia, Flawlessly and Sunday Silence. Who can forget Sunday Silence winning the Kentucky Derby in 1989? Or Ferdinand winning the Derby for Whittingham in 1986.

Jerkens, Stephens and Whittingham all had two things in common. They spent most of their time in the barn with their horses, and their horses were always fitter, physically and mentally, than their competition. If a horse turned a hair, they knew about it. And they always gave their best. Especially when it counted.

That, was horse training.



Road To The Kentucky Derby

'Already Proven' At Distance, Instant Coffee Headlines Saturday's Lecomte



Woodbine's 2022 leading rider Kazushi Kimura won his first-ever Santa Anita race in style on Sunday, as he drove the John Sadler-trained Kirstenbosch to a desperate nose victory over favoured Ganadora in the \$200,000 La Canada Stakes (G3), the same race that gave Manitoba-bred superstar Escape Clause her first graded stakes win four years ago. Sam Houston handle plummets 91 percent

Without nationwide simulcasting total wagering drops from \$11.75 million on six days of live racing last year to \$1.04 million on seven days this year



Top NFL Picks by TravyFootball: Divisional Round

Giants over Eagles (Saturday evening): The number one seed in the NFC finally gets to see some playoff action when they host the New York Giants, who defeated the fraudulent Minnesota Vikings on wildcard weekend. Giants quarterback Daniel Jones had an excellent game in his first playoff appearance, throwing for over 300 yards and tossing two touchdown passes while also adding 78 yards



rushing. These teams played just a couple weeks ago with the Eagles winning 22-16, but the Giants weren't playing any of their starters in that game, and still managed to hold their own. Eagles quarterback Jalen Hurts definitely needed the bye week off to rest his injured shoulder, and even with that he still might not be 100%. The Eagles will win or lose with Hurts, because in the last few games, when he didn't play, Gardner Minshew, the backup quarterback, was a complete disaster.

Bills over Bengals (Sunday afternoon): Maybe it's just divine fate that these two are facing off in the playoffs, considering what happened a few weeks ago when they were supposed to play on Monday night. I don't know how I can talk about this game without mentioning the excellent progress Damar Hamlin is making in his recovery. As far as the actual game goes, it will be interesting. Buffalo's defense didn't play particularly great last week against the Dolphins. You could make the argument that if they weren't starting a third string QB (teams can't all be as lucky as SF), playing the Dolphins, they very well could've won that game. Josh Allen seems to be turning the ball over a lot more frequently and he really has to clean that up. The Bengals are a little banged up on the offensive line and that might be an issue for Joe Burrow if they aren't able to block for him. Just like the Bills, the Bengals didn't play well last week either, and if it wasn't for the fumble 6 they also could have lost that game to the Ravens.

49ers over Cowboys (Sunday night): Boy oh boy... am I ever pumped for this one. I can tolerate Vikings fans, and I can put up with Packers fans, but Cowboys fans are on a whole different level of annoyance. In a rematch from last years wild card game that caused my blood pressure to rise multiple times within the span of three hours, my 49ers will host "Dem boys" from Dallas in what should be the game of the weekend.... or will it?
