Assiniboia Downs' CEO Darren Dunn was honoured with the Queen Elizabeth II Platinum Jubilee Medal (Manitoba) on January 24, 2023 at the Manitoba Legislative Building.

"As a Province, we are proud to take this opportunity to recognize the outstanding service of Manitobans who have done much to build and enhance our Province," said The Honourable Heather Stefanson, Premier of Manitoba. "You are among this distinguished group.

"I thank you for your leadership, your dedicated service to your peers, to your community, to Manitoba and to Canada. The contributions you have made to our Province are highly commendable and deserve our praise and admiration. May you wear your Medal with justified pride in your own accomplishments and in commemoration of this significant and unique milestone for our late Queen."

Dunn was nominated to receive the award by MLA for Kirkfield Park, Kevin Klein (and former MLA Scott Fielding). The award marks the 70th anniversary of Her Late Majesty's accession to the Throne as Queen of Canada. The Medal is a tangible way for the province of Manitoba to honour Her Late Majesty for her service to Canada.

Randy Premachuk Wins Player's Choice Tourney

Long-time horse owner and handicapper scores big with late longshots

Longtime handicapper and horse owner Randy Premachuk came flying home late with two longshots at Santa Anita to win last Saturday's Player's Choice Handicapping Tournament with a bankroll of \$144.70, and his bankroll would have been even higher if not for a jockey miscalculation.

Even without that, Premachuk still finished a whopping \$34.10 ahead of his nearest pursuer in the contest, runner-up Evelyn Tilston-Jones (\$110.60), who was followed by Dave Boehmer (\$110.10), Greg Earl (\$74.30) and Keith MacLennan (\$74.10). See full tournament results here.

In the fifth race at Tampa Bay, Premachuk, played General Robinson, a 5/2 morning-line horse going off at 8-1, and there's no question he should have won. General Robinson stalked a duel, moved to the lead outside in the stretch and accelerated every time the jockey asked him too, until the last jump, when the jockey forgot to ask, and the 9/5 favourite rallied up the rail to snatch victory from sure defeat.

The second-place finish got Premachuk off to reasonable start, but it wasn't until the eighth and ninth races at Santa Anita that he really got rolling. In the eighth at Santa Anita, he found Duvet Day at 12-1, whose stablemate was favoured in the race. Premachuk thought they were over betting the Argentinian shipper and a few other entrants in the race. He also heard trainer Michael McCarthy say in the pre-race analysis that he thought Duvet Day would like the 1 ½-mile distance.

"There was only one horse in the race that had previously gone a mile and a half," said Premachuk. "So I thought they were going to bet that one too. I pulled the trigger on Duvet

Day feeling quite confident, and he came like a freight train late."

Duvet Day spent most of the race at the back of the field under Woodbine's reigning leading rider Kazushi Kimura, came 7-wide into the stretch, and exploded to catch the leader late in a replay worth watching. He paid \$27.30, \$10.70 \$4.50 across the board.

In the ninth race at Santa Anita Premachuk played Stay in the Game at 19-1 and that horse also came flying home with what seemed an impossible late rally to catch the leader at the wire. Stay In the Game paid \$41.70, \$12.60 \$5.60 and definitely put Premachuk at the top of his game.

"Sometimes when you're playing in a contest and you're behind, you're searching for longshots, you're taking some stabs," said Premachuk. "But in in this particular contest I didn't feel I took any. I thought the long shots I played were logical.

"After I hit that first one, I was prepared to wait for another longshot, but I started looking at the ninth race more and more, and I thought Stay in the Game could really be competitive. He'd just broken his maiden and he was running an allowance race and his morning line was 10-1. So it wasn't like I was looking at a 30-1 shot, but he went off at 19-1."

Premachuk is a comprehensive handicapper who has been at the game for over 40 years, both as a handicapper and a horse owner. The co-owner of Dave's Quick Print has won a number of contests in the past, and he's also owned a few stakes-quality horses including Smoke Show, who finished second in both the CTHS Sales Stakes and Hazel Wright Sire Stakes, and Hey Bro, who finished second in the R. J. Speers Stakes locally and third in the Harvest Plate Stakes at Century Downs.

Premachuk claims horses and also buys yearlings from the <u>Manitoba CTHS Yearling Sale</u>. With a little bit of luck, he says he could have won some stakes, but his purchases have been stakes placed.

"I've always done well with the horses I've bought there," said Premachuk. "I've had some success with some of the horses I've bought from Cam Ziprick in the sale, and I've had fun."

Premachuk plans to use his \$1,000 first prize towards a trip to Hawaii in February, and in the upcoming season at the Downs he's looking forward to campaigning Rollin Sevens. The former Winnipeg Futurity runner-up is now a 6-year-old on the comeback trail, and he's as game as they come when he's able to get into the race early.

When he's not running Dave's Quick Print, Premachuk loves to spend time with his horses both at the track and at his farm in East Selkirk, where he keeps a few horses including Smoke Show. When he had horses at the track with the late Ardell Sayler, he spent a lot of time in the barn.

"They called me the carrot man," said Premachuk. In other words...

A winner.





This is Part #3 of our series in which we remember Albert Edward Blake. Blake and John Sifton were a force to be reckoned with in the late 1960s. Pictured above is Clique, a son of the great Round Table, and one of their best racehorses. On June 14, 1968, Clique broke the track record for 7-furlongs at ASD. His time of 1:24 would stand for 10 years. A few short weeks after setting the track record, Clique won the 1968 running of the Gold Cup.
