### **Groom School now Taking Applications for Paid Training**

Looking for a summer job? Love horses? Learn how to groom racehorses!

If you're a horse lover, you already know that grooming horses is one of the most rewarding and satisfying experiences in life. And if you're an animal lover looking for a job, but you lack experience with horses, the <a href="Manitoba HBPA">Manitoba HBPA</a> may have just what you're looking for.

A paid training program to learn how to groom racehorses!

The HBPA is now accepting applications for its second annual Groom School, a paid training program that prepares you to work with horses at the racetrack. They're looking for motivated, reliable, hardworking horse lovers who would like to train to become a racehorse groom. No experience is required, but a positive attitude and a willingness to learn are a must.

"Anyone can apply for the four weeks of paid training," said Manitoba HBPA office manager Shannon Dawley. "We're giving people an opportunity to step inside the racetrack and learn what it is we do, we're going to pay them for it, and we're going to find you a job at the end of it.

"Horses are the driving force behind everything we do. A love and respect for the animal, and a desire to want to learn and work with them everyday is what keeps us all going. Instructors have a wealth of knowledge and are looking forward to passing that along, as well as helping participants get their start in a new vocation. Grooming horses is one step towards numerous careers in the racing industry."

Applicants for the program must be 15-29 years old, but if you're 15, you must be turning 16 this year. Sponsored by the Manitoba government's First Jobs Fund, last year the program had 19 graduates.

"It's hard for me to really single anyone out from last year," said Dawley. "But the program resulted in some phenomenal grooms. Meadow McLean was great with trainer Wendy Anderson. Skyla Blanchard turned out wonderful for trainer Devon Gittens. And Megan Gale worked out beautifully for trainer Jennifer Jordan. And all three were nominated for the First Year Groom of the Year Award." (See The Inside Track #48)

"Any groom who goes anywhere that has to do with horses, who has worked at the racetrack, is more employable with this kind of experience," said Dawley. "And if you love horses, there's probably nowhere else you'd rather be."

The hours for the groom school training are Monday to Friday from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m. Once the grooms enter the barn area to work with trainers, grooms are expected to work five hours a day for six days a week.

"Some of the students choose that they want a Friday or Saturday off, but we leave that up to the instructors in the barn," said Dawley. "Full time at the track is often considered to be six days a week. If you're looking at four or five days a week, you need to be honest with us when we're looking for employment for you, so we can relay that information to the trainers. Will it affect your employability, probably, but are you still employable? Yes."

The first class of Groom School training begins on March 20. There are five people per class and there are 25 spots available. The deadline for applications is March 10, but the earlier the submission the better based on the limited number of spots.

"Parents should tell their kids about this," said Dawley. "If your kids love horses and you need to get them out of the house, this is the perfect way to do it. We love our grooms. And it's definitely a rewarding job.

"Yes, it's hard work, but it's hard work that pays off. Spending time one-on-one with the horses is so rewarding, and to look down the shedrow and see all your horses nickering at you because they realize you're the one that feeds them and looks after them -- it just feels good. You've accomplished something that is very satisfying. You look at your clean barn and your freshly groomed and fed horses and say, 'I did that.'

"It's something to be proud of."



Series aims to tell stories behind owners, trainers, breeders, and jockeys involved



#### Top NFL Picks by TravyFootball: Super Bowl LVII

Chiefs over Eagles (Sunday evening): After a long and grinding season it has finally come down to this. Super Bowl LVII will take place at the State Farm Stadium in Phoenix, Arizona on Sunday evening.

A familiar face will represent the AFC as the Kansas City Chiefs led by Patrick Mahomes make their third Super Bowl appearance in four years, which is pretty



remarkable in its itself. They are 1-1 in the big game, having defeated the San Francisco 49ers in 2020, and losing to the Tampa Bay Bucs in 2021. I don't think this task will be as tough as either of those prior games were, and I feel that the Eagles really had an easy pathway to the Super Bowl, as opposed to how the Chiefs got there. Philadelphia has not faced a quarterback of Patrick Mahomes calibre and this will be the ultimate test for the Eagles defense.

Speaking of the Eagles, they will be making their second Super Bowl appearance in five years, previously defeating the New England Patriots back in 2017. They will be led this time by quarterback Jalen Hurts, who has had quite the up-and-down football career going back to his days at Alabama. Depending on who you ask, Hurts very well could end up as the NFL MVP, but I think the fact that he got injured and missed a couple of games during the season will cost him that award.

The task for Hurts and the Eagles' offense will be to keep pace with the Chiefs' offense, which knows how to score. Hurts will also be hoping the defense that held San Francisco to only seven points (with no healthy Quarterback!) can do something similar against Kansas City, but like I said earlier, this will be their toughest task to date against arguably the best team of the last five years.
