# **Spitten Kitten wins 43rd Chantilly Stakes**

\$2,500 yearling purchase beats best from Alberta, has now earned \$58,380 US!

Spitten Kitten beat the best from Alberta in the \$50,000 Chantilly Stakes on Tuesday, sixtime leading trainer Tom Gardipy, Jr. surged to the lead in the trainer standings with four wins and four jockeys scored hat tricks last week in an effort to make some headway on runaway leader Antonio Whitehall.

Facing heavily favoured four-time Alberta stakes winner Big Hug among six rivals in the Chantilly, Spitten Kitten exploded out of the gate under jockey Sven Balroop, opened up nearing the turn, and smoothly clawed her way home to win the 43<sup>rd</sup> running of the race for trainer Marvin Buffalo, his wife Deb and ownership partner Arnold Souster.

Alberta shipper Super Caro, trained by Colleen O'Hagan, gave her best in the stretch to get within a length of Spitten Kitten at the wire, while Big Hug rallied mildly to finish third. A four-time winner, Super Caro had been running in \$20,000 claiming races on the turf at Tampa Bay before finishing second to Big Hug in the Chariot Chaser Handicap at Century Mile in her start previous to the Chantilly.

Purchased for only \$2,500 as a yearling by Marvin and Deb Buffalo at a fall mixed sale in Arizona, Spitten Kitten has now earned a whopping \$58,380 (US) for her owners and is two-for-two at Assiniboia Downs. The daughter of multiple Group 1 winner Air Force Blue would appear to have a bright future ahead of her, thanks to the excellent development work by Marvin and Deb Buffalo.

The Chantilly took place on the eve of National Indigenous Peoples Day, and it seemed so perfectly fitting that Tom Gardipy, Jr. from Beardy's Cree Nation in Saskatchewan was on hand to make the presentation to Marvin Buffalo, who hails from Day Star First Nation in the same province.

Gardipy moved into top spot in the trainer standings with his four wins including Roaming Union (\$58.50), the biggest longshot winner of the meeting so far. Gardipy now has 10 wins, one more than trainer Jerry Gourneau, who also continued to roll with three wins on the week.

Four jockeys scored triples on the week including Jorge Carreno, Ronald Ali, Prayven Badrie, and Damario Bynoe, but are still well back of Antonio Whitehall, who has 19 wins. Badrie and Ali are tied for second in the standings with 11 wins apiece, one more than Carreno and Bynoe, who are tied for third in the standings with 10 wins.

While Whitehall only had one win on the week, he has a number of horses coming back that are sitting on a win, and on the trainer side, Jerry Gourneau apparently has more horses coming from top owner Henry S. Witt, Jr.

Both could prove very tough to beat.

# Ron Zurba Wins First Las Vegas Challenge of Season

Longtime horse owner finishes 60 cents in front to win \$3,500 and trophy

Longtime handicapper and horse owner Ron Zurba squeaked out a narrow victory over Roger Jones in the first monthly Las Vegas Challenge Handicapping Contest of the season on Monday, and it felt great.

"This Ukrainian doesn't win too many things," laughed Zurba. "I'm pretty pumped about it I'll tell ya. I was sitting on the edge here waiting for the final results. I feel bad for the guy who finished second. Even the guy who finished third wasn't off by much. Wow. But to win or lose by 60 cents, that's a crime."

It was the first win in the tourney for the 74-year-old retired air traffic controller, and it came with only 60 cents to spare. Zurba built his bankroll to \$109.30 to edge runner up Roger Jones (\$108.70) and Geoffrey Gard (\$107.50) and win the \$3,500 first prize and the trophy. Glen Gray (\$106.90) and Brian McKellar (\$98.00) rounded out the top five.

Zurba has been handicapping races since he was a kid and has owned horses since the 1980s.

"I have to go back to my days with my dad and his buddies phoning in through the bookies in the North end," said Zurba. "That's where it all started. My dad would give me the

program and I would fluke a couple wins for him, some exactors and quinellas. And he started taking me out to the track and I learned that way.

"I don't know if I've ever come up with a surefire method for picking winners, I don't think anyone has. I'm always looking for ways to try to find that key that unlocks the horse that nobody else thinks can win."

Zurba's biggest winner on Monday was Roaming Union (\$58.50) in the sixth race, but that horse was also bet by a number of other players, as evidenced by the close scores. Zurba thinks the horse that really got him the goods was Dot and Dash (\$15.60) in the second race.

"I listened to Stretch and Kirt discuss him on the <u>handicapping show</u>," said Zurba. "And I liked the fact he was getting first-time Lasix, and he was going off at 20-1."

Zurba has been involved in the Assiniboia Racing Club run by John Field for the last few years. The group claimed a horse at Aqueduct through former ASD trainer Rob Atras, and they're hoping it will start soon. He's also been involved in a breeding syndicate with 12 people, but he's going to try to convince them into buying a horse at the <a href="CTHS Manitoba">CTHS Manitoba</a> Yearling Sale in August.

The first horse Zurba ever owned was Belle Plaine, who he claimed with a friend and trainer Mike Smith in the 1980s. "We claimed her for \$12,500, and that was a lot of money back then. She won the CTHS Matchmaker Stakes, and I thought this was the easiest way to make money in my life."

Experience has taught him different, but Zurba just keeps going.

"Age is just a number," laughed Zurba. "Like your bank account, but I don't know. My age is going up, but my bank account is going the other way." Until Monday.

And he's not done yet.

"I've probably been retired for almost 15 years now," said Zurba. "I've done some little stints, like a shuttle driver for a car dealership and I drove some cars for Adesa for sales and things like that. I'm on the HBPA Board of Directors, so I help out there. Besides screwing around at home and doing things around the racetrack, as long as my health holds out...

"I'm a happy little bird."




On August 28th Assiniboia Downs will run the Miss Sandy Dee Overnight Stakes. The multiple stakes-winning Florida-bred mare was a rock-solid distaff force at the Downs. From 2000 to 2003 she compiled a Downs record of 10 wins, six seconds and two thirds from 26 starts. Sandy's career earnings totaled \$183,349 and saw her chalk-up wins in the Matron, Winnipeg Sun, and Victoria Day Stakes. She was owned by the SEL Stable, trained by Patti Ross, and had our own Derek Corbel as her exercise rider. (Gerry Hart Photo)


