Spitten Kitten Romps, Bargain Manitoba-Bred Yearlings Win \$2,500 yearling tops \$100K mark, \$1,000 Manitoba-bred yearlings break \$50K

Spitten Kitten romped to her third straight stakes victory on Monday and bargain Manitoba-breds delivered impressive performances in restricted stakes on Tuesday and Wednesday.

Spitten Kitten faced her toughest local field yet in the 30th running of the \$50,000 Jack Hardy Stakes on Monday and was sent off as a slight favourite over Alberta shipper Super Caro. It wasn't close.

Spitten Kitten was stretching out beyond six furlongs for the first tine in her eight-race career in the 7 1/2-furlong Jack Hardy, and on paper it looked like she might have some pressure up front. Jockey Sven Balroop made sure there would be none of that when he rocketed out of the gate on the "Kitten" and never looked back.

Spitten Kitten opened an instant two-length lead, turned back an outside bid from Where's the Pumps after a half mile, took a short lead into the final turn and exploded in the stretch to win by 10 ½-lengths in fast time. Super Caro and Reasonably Lovely rallied for second and third in the cakewalk, and Spitten Kitten's future brightened yet another notch since being purchased for only \$2,500 by trainer Marvin Buffalo and his wife Deb as a yearling.

The 3-year-old chestnut filly by Air Force Blue-Zahrah by Kitten's Joy has some pedigree to work with and who knows how good she might get. Spitten Kitten won \$30,600 for her victory on Monday and broke through the \$100,000 barrier in earnings from a career record of 5-0-0 in eight starts. She has now won four in a row and it's going to take a good horse to beat her.

Great development job by Marvin and Deb Buffalo!

On Tuesday night fans were treated to a great stretch duel between two quality Manitobabred 3-year-old fillies in the 15th running of the \$40,000 Hazel Wright Sire Stakes. Mechanic Susie got the best of Russian Pearl by a head at the wire, but there were no losers in this one.

Trained by Elton Dickey and ridden by leading rider Antonio Whitehall for Dickey and his ownership partners Tom Payne and breeder Larry Falloon, Mechanic Susie was winning for the second time in her six-start career, but it certainly hasn't been for lack of trying.

Purchased for just \$1,000 in the 2021 Manitoba CTHS Yearling Sale by Dickey, the bay 3-year-old filly by Nonios-Quantum Mechanics by Einstein has now earned \$54,930.

Runner-up Russian Pearl was not only also sired by Nonios, but was also originally purchased for \$1,000 at the local sale by Elton Dickey. Bred by Falloon and Denis Huberdeau, Russian Pearl later went to trainer Devon Gittens with current owners Larry Falloon and Ron Wiley. She earned \$8,160 on Tuesday night and upped her career earnings to \$51,395.

And we're not done with the bargain yearlings yet!

On Wednesday night, Manitoba-bred Private Frank made quick work of his field in the 35th running of the \$40,000 Frank Arnason Sire Stakes, and the heavy favourite was never in doubt under jockey Ronald Ali, winning by 2 ¾-lengths over I Love My Life.

Trained by Tom Gardipy, Jr. for owner-breeders Jerry Lambert and Lynn Mathews, the big 3-year-old chestnut gelding by Going Commando-Inspeightofsuccess by Speightstown was bid up to only \$1,000 at the 2021 Manitoba CTHS Yearling Sale and was bought back by his owner-breeders.

Private Frank has shown both heart and talent in his short four-race career, winning from off the pace and on the lead, and has now won three in a row. He added \$24,000 to his coffers on Wednesday, increasing his lifetime earnings to \$50,524.

# **Murray Chaban wins July Las Vegas Challenge**

Murray Chaban won the Las Vegas Challenge handicapping tournament on Monday for the umpteenth time, but his margin of victory was summer slim.

The margin of victory is always smaller during the summer tournaments, and Chaban built his bankroll to \$64.70, which was just enough to win the July tourney by \$1.20 over Myron Fedoruk (\$63.50), who was followed home by Keith MacLennan (\$59.00), Rob Solmundson (\$57.50), Gerald Houle (\$55.00) and Trevor Phelps (\$55.00).

Chaban won \$3,500 cash and a trophy for his victory, thanks to "Plan B."

"The first part of the contest went according to plan," said Chaban. "But in the fifth race, I took Highriseinthepeg. He had a morning line of 25-1 and I was confident in him based on his previous race, but unfortunately he was carried out and finished third at 10-1. Had he won I would have taken Ride Em in the sixth race and Spitten Kitten in the seventh, but I went to Plan B after he lost."

Plan B in the sixth race was Club Champ, who had a morning line of 25-1 and ended up going off at 8-1. Club Champ had a new trainer off the claim (Jared Brown), and was getting a jockey switch to Jorge Carreno. Club Champ won and paid \$18.80, which also probably won Chaban the contest, although all of his picks hit the board. More importantly, Monday was his birthday!

The retired post office worker has been playing the races since the early seventies and has won both the Las Vegas Challenge and Player's Choice tourneys more than once.


"It's a challenge," said Chaban. "An educated form of gambling. It makes you think. And I love the camaraderie with other handicappers. It's fun.

"When I first came out here in the 'seventies, I looked at the horses like everyone else did in the sixties, but I met a fella who taught me how to read the *Daily Racing Form*. His name was Dan Black. I still see him here today. We actually went to Vegas together, after he won a contest here. I finished ninth and he finished fifth overall. At the time, a fifth-place finish was worth over \$20,000."

Chaban continued to learn from practical experience but also read a number of handicapping books. "Anything I could get a hold of," said Chaban.

"I have to make sure I don't play horses I don't think can win. The horses I use have to show something, I'm not just going to throw a dart. There's some luck involved, but basically, if it's your day, and your type of horses are coming in, you can win."

They were. And he did!





## A Snapshot in Time

Jack Whittier won the first ever Manitoba "Derby" in 1930, which at the time was held at Polo Park Racetrack. The first Derby was run in 1930, but from 1930 to 1933 it was known as the Manitoba Stakes. In 1934 the name of the race was officially changed to the Manitoba Derby. Jim Speers established the race for horsemen in an effort to showcase thoroughbreds that were foaled in Western Canada. In 1936 the Derby was opened to all horses bred in Canada. The race was run annually at old Polo Park in all years except 1937, when it was run at Whittier Park in St. Boniface. In 1941 the Canadian Derby was born out of our own Manitoba Derby. 
## Beginner's Guide to the 2023 Saratoga Race Course Meet
