



Upsets, Longshots, Huge Payoffs Rule Week at ASD

Lone FanDuel (TVG) bettor wins \$69,860 on ASD Jackpot Pick 5 with \$4.80 Ticket!

Freshly claimed Saskatchewan-bred Delvecchio won the 7th running of the \$40,000 Phil Kives Stakes on Monday, Manitoba-bred Melisandre wired her field in the 28th running of the \$40,000 Distaff Stakes on Tuesday, and Hey Hey Run Away became the longest-price winner of the meeting in the seventh race on Tuesday, which helped one lucky bettor scoop the whole pool in the ASD Jackpot Pick 5 to the tune of \$69,860!

Devecchio (\$10.20) got the longshot train rolling on Monday when he wired his field in the Phil Kives Stakes under jockey Damario Bynoe for trainer Mike Nault, owner A2 Thoroughbreds, breeder W. Don Bjarnson, and groom Charlotte Johnston.

Making his first start since being claimed for \$10,000, the 7-year-old gelding by Where's the Ring looked powerful on the front end, opening up on favoured McKague early and turning that one back again into the final turn before drawing out to win by 4 ½-lengths. Delvecchio took home \$24,580 for his big win, easily paying for himself in his first start for new trainer Mike Nault.

The upsets continued on Tuesday, albeit of the milder variety, when Manitoba-bred Melisandre (\$5.00) took the rail and the lead early in the Distaff Stakes under jockey Antonio Whitehall and never looked back, holding on to defeat resurging favourite Lady Cop by two lengths.

Trained by Lise Pruitt, owned by True North Thoroughbreds and Arnason Farms, bred by Cam Ziprick, Charles Fouillard and Barry Arnason, and groomed by Richie Rickets, Melisandre was winning her second stakes of 2023, having previously won the Cool Excellence Overnight Stakes on June 6. The 5-year-old mare by Going Commando went over the \$200,000 mark in earnings with her Distaff win and once again highlighted the fact that it pays to buy Manitoba-breds.

On the same evening, Hey Hey Run Away became the longest-priced winner of the meeting when she held on to take the seventh race. The 8-year-old mare paid \$164.40, \$68.10, \$13.90 across the board for trainer Jared Brown, owner 2 Points Ranch and jockey Arthur Budhu.

Hey Hey Run Away had been beaten over 56 lengths in her previous four starts, finishing ninth beaten 9 1/4-lengths in her most recent start under leading rider Whitehall. And in her three starts previous to that she'd been ridden by top jockey Jorge Carreno. Must have been the rider switch to Budhu!

Hey Hey Run Away's big payoff was part of the sequence in the ASD Jackpot Pick 5 score made by a player from FanDuel (TVG) on Tuesday night, who bet a 0.20 Pick 5 that included 0.6/2, 0.2/2, 0.

And get this. The last race on Tuesday was won by jockey Antonio Whitehall and Hezadoozie (\$22.70), which resulted in a \$1 Pick 4 payoff of \$8,533.40. Hezadoozie defeated fellow longshot Pickingupstrangers (\$44.55) by a neck. The \$1 Pick 4 payoff to Pickingupstrangers, as shared by one of our loyal Twitter (X) followers that goes by the name of Marco, would have paid \$59,733!



Groom Charlotte Johnston lead Delvecchio into the winner's circle on Monday after his victory in the

Tarasenco booted home Sparkling Silver (\$58.60) for trainer Carl Anderson, topping a 20cent Superfecta payoff of \$4,676.75.

Tarasenco is in the second year of a comeback off a 24-year-layoff and he's amazingly riding better than he was during his first 14 years at Assiniboia Downs beginning in 1985. He has now compiled an excellent record of 11-8-7 from 65 starts, and Budhu's not far behind, with a record of 9-4-10 from 62 starts. Both jockeys are beating the odds.

back their horses if they don't get their price, and the horses that do sell are bringing in good money for their breeders.

The yearlings by proven Manitoba sire Nonios sold as expected and the first crop of Speculating yearlings also lived up to lofty expectations. The lucrative breeding and stallion awards, and the excellent purse structure and bonuses available at Assiniboia Downs for Manitoba-breds, make it a win-win situation for both breeders and buyers.

Additional horses were sold privately after the sale. Hip #13, a bay filly by Vengeful Wildcat-Plain Brown by Sightseeing, consigned by Dr. Betty Hughes, was sold to A2 Thoroughbreds, and Hip #5, a bay gelding by Nonios-Mairia by Old Forester, also consigned by Hughes, was bought by trainer Devon Gittens and owner Ron Wiley.

Falloon has been involved with racehorses for over 30 years, and purchased Nonios with partners Andrew Clarke and Denis Huberdeau to stand at Maggie Lawson's Dunroven Farm in Rosser, Manitoba, a few years ago. The Affirmed Handicap-G3 winner has become a solid proven sire of winners and stakes winners in Manitoba, and Falloon and Huberdeau are finally being rewarded for their years of investment in the racing game.



Brian McKellar Wins Las Vegas Challenge Tourney

2018 Handicapper of the Year and multi-time winner reclaims monthly crown

Former Handicapper of the Year and multiple-tournament winner Brian McKellar won the August Las Vegas Challenge Handicapping Tournament on Monday, and his margin of victory was much higher than we've seen lately.

McKellar turned his \$60 bankroll in a \$94.60 to take home \$3,500, a trophy and bragging rights, defeating Geoffrey Gard (\$88.60) by \$6.30, followed by Kevin Arnst (\$79.60), Nicole Baker (\$71.60) and Geoffrey Metcalf (\$62.30).

Four of the top five finishers in the contest including McKellar, Gard, Arnst, and Baker, along with Brent Daurie, also split the \$100 prize for selecting the longest-priced winner in

the contest, Happy Hour, in the third race, which paid \$28.20, \$12.40, \$8.60 across the board.

McKellar lost his first two contest bets, but then hit with Happy Hour in the third race, and rolled home with six straight cashes including winners Gentrified (\$6.50) in the fifth race, Stan's Starlet (\$5.80) in the seventh and Mia's Majesty (\$6.20) in the eighth.

The king has reclaimed his crown.







Mano Dura has much to gain in \$200,000 Canadian Derby

Manitoba Derby winner faces 11 rivals in Western Canadian Triple Crown quest





Manitoba Derby victor Mano Dura will look to continue his winning ways going 1 1/4-miles against a deep field in the second leg of the Western Canadian Triple Crown on Saturday in the Grade 3, \$200,000 Canadian Derby at Century Mile in Edmonton, Alberta. The series concludes with the Grade 3 British Columbia Derby on Sept. 16 at Hastings. There's a \$100,000 bonus in waiting if Mano Dura sweeps the three prestigious races for 3-year-olds. In addition, the Canadian Derby winner gets a paid entry into the Grade 3 Ontario Derby on Oct. 21 at Woodbine. More from the Daily Racing Form here.
