



At The Post with G.S. Thompson

Carl Anderson wins J.W. Sifton Stakes with Fresh Claim Trainers Steve Keplin, Jr., Wendy Anderson have big 4-win weeks

Trainer Carl Anderson pulled off one of the biggest upsets of the year in the \$40,000 J.W. Sifton Stakes with "Comeback Kid" Tim Tarasenco in the irons, trainers Steve Keplin, Jr. and Wendy Anderson won four races each, and apprentice Fraser Aebly continued his hot streak with another hat trick this week at ASD.

Carl Anderson has been winning big races with unexpected charges since 1964, the most memorable being Gold Cup winner Black is Beautiful (1982). His reputation with good

horses is as good as it gets in these parts, and also includes Gold Cup winners Deputy Country (2004) and Albarino (2005), among others. He'd won the J.W. Sifton Stakes twice in the past with Resurgent (2005) and McKague (2020), but on Tuesday he added a new twist to his stakes-winning repertoire to win the Sifton for a third time.

Anderson saddled freshly claimed longshot Sugar Daddy Jack (\$19.00) for owner Tom Boyko to win the 53rd running of Manitoba's richest race for Manitoba and Saskatchewan foaled 3-year-old colts and geldings, upsetting heavy favourites Private Frank and I Love My Life, who went hard at each other for at least five furlongs in the 1 1/8-mile race, setting it up for a rallier, in this case Sugar Daddy Jack.

Haltered for just \$6,250 on August 28, the Manitoba-bred by Nonios-Nickel Candy by Silver Deputy had won his previous start on August 14 in a \$7,500 claiming race for non-winners of two lifetime and Anderson decided to take a shot on the half-brother to nine-winners including 2012 Gold Rush Futurity runner-up Manewal. It paid off.

Stalking a duel between favourites Private Frank and I Love My Life from the inside under jockey Tim Tarasenco, Sugar Daddy Jack came flying home to catch duel winner I Love My Life at the sixteenth pole and drew out to win by 1 1/4-lengths over another rallying longshot, Valid Defence.

Bred by Larry Falloon of Foxwarren, Manitoba, Sugar Daddy Jack gave another Manitoba product, jockey Tim Tarasenco, his first stakes win of the season, the icing on the cake for a great comeback season after more than 20 years off.

Trainers Wendy Anderson and Steve Keplin, Jr. also had an excellent week.

Keplin scored a hat trick on Monday with Something Super (\$10.90), Explosive (\$6.80) and Smart Call (\$4.10) and added another victory on Wednesday with Wherethemoneywent (\$4.10).

Wendy Anderson went on a roll of her own on Tuesday, winning the sixth and seventh races with Henrisincontrol (\$11.40) and Maybe Sometime (\$20.00) respectively, and continued right into Wednesday with a win in the first race with The Lonna Ranger (\$3.00) for the natural hat trick. Anderson also won the fifth race on Wednesday with Saxon Saga (\$3.30).

Anderson's winners were split between jockeys Renaldo Cumberbatch and Fraser Aebly, who joined Damario Bynoe as the top jocks for the week with three wins a piece.

There will be a few more available mounts next week, as 2021-2022 leading rider Jorge Carreno returned south for the winter while sitting third in the standings at the time. He just wasn't going to catch jockey Antonio Whitehall. Whitehall now has 52 wins, 14 more than runner-up Damario Bynoe, and has been riding with strong confidence this season.

Also of note, a special ceremony was held for former Assiniboia Downs leading rider (1986,1987,1989) and seven-time Sovereign Award winner Todd Kabel of McCreary Manitoba, who passed away in 2021 at the age of 55. *Homestretch to Heaven: In Memory of Todd Kabel*, took place after the first race.

First and foremost, I'm sure everyone has heard about Aaron Rodgers by now. Look, whether you are a fan of the guy or you not, nobody wants to see him injured. It always hits closer to home when I hear players go down with an Achilles tear, as I have personally been down that road twice. If you're curious about what it sounded like, take a balloon, blow it up as big as possible, and then pop it with a pin. That would simulate the sound of my Achilles tearing. It's a really depressing feeling knowing that you're going to be pretty much out of action for at least a year, and that's if everything heals correctly. So here's to Rodgers making a full recovery and hopefully he can end his career on a higher note!



Niners over Rams (Sunday afternoon): Any doubt about Brock Purdy was put to rest very early in the Steelers game last week. He looked as if he was never injured in the first place. It's hard to imagine that six months ago he tore his UCL and wasn't even expected to be ready for the season, but just like he's done his whole career, he defied expectations and came back way earlier. It didn't take long for him to hook up with Brandon Aiyuk for the Niners first touchdown of the year, and he followed that up shortly afterwards with another touchdown pass to Aiyuk. Steelers defensive back Patrick Peterson, who earlier in the week said that the Niners offense had "tells" and that he was definitely going to get an interception off Purdy, had to eat crow. Not only did he fail to get an interception, but he also gave up two touchdowns -- some very humbling moments. Now San Fran will travel to Los Angeles to meet their division rivals, the Rams. I don't know if you can call this a rivalry when San Fran has won the last eight regular season meetings, but maybe... pigs will fly? I will give the Rams a little bit of credit though, going into Seattle last week, missing Cooper Kupp, and still pulling off the victory was impressive, *slow clap*.


Bengals over Ravens (Sunday noon): The Bengals were easily the most disappointing team last week. It's not a good look when you hand your quarterback \$275 million and then the very first game afterwards, he stinks it up and only throws for 82 yards. You could chalk it up to the bad weather, but for whatever reason, Burrow always struggles against the Browns. I can't imagine him being that bad two weeks in a row so he should have a nice bounce back game against a Ravens team that's already starting to lose players due to injury. Speaking of quarterbacks being handed a lot of money in the off-season, after a long drawn out dispute, Lamar Jackson was handed \$260 million from the Ravens, and then also proceeded to have a terrible week one performance. Often injured running back JK Dobbins was lost for the season due to an Achilles tear (what's up with Achilles this year) and I'm not sure how the Ravens plan to replace him.

Bucs over Bears (Sunday noon): One of the bigger upsets of last week was the Tom Brady-less Tampa Bay Buccaneers defeating the Minnesota Vikings on the road. It wasn't a pretty game, maybe because Baker Mayfield isn't a good quarterback, but the biggest thing he did, was NOT turn the ball over. The defense handled the rest, holding the Vikings to only 17 points and forcing two turnovers by Kirk Cousins. I spoke about the revamped Chicago Bears last week, but after watching them play against the Packers, the more things change the more things stay the same. Even with a better offensive line and more offensive weapons, quarterback Justin Fields still looked completely lost out there. I don't expect things to get any easier for him going against a pretty good Tampa Bay defense.




