Manitoba-Bred Showcase - Top 5 Earners of 2023

Homebreds continued to outperform their purchase prices once again in 2023

Manitoba-breds once again continued to outperform their <u>Manitoba CTHS</u> Yearling Sale purchase prices in 2023.

While all were eligible for the lucrative Manitoba-bred bonus programs, they also held their own in open company, which is a credit to all their connections including the breeders, trainers, grooms and owners. All have stepped up their game in synch with the higher quality pedigrees seen in Manitoba over the past decade.

Below are the top five Manitoba-bred earners of 2023 at Assiniboia Downs, with more homebred highlights to follow in the next issue of The Inside Track.

Commandoslastdance (\$47,155)

Commandoslastdance won two of her five starts in 2023 including the \$50,000 Debutante Stakes over open company and the \$40,000 Buffalo Stakes for trainer Mike Nault and ownership partners A2 Thoroughbreds and True North Thoroughbreds. She also finished third in the \$50,000 Osiris Stakes. Bred by Keaton and Aiden Ziprick, the 2-year-old filly by Going Commando-Sweet Tizzy Lizzy by Tiznow was a \$17,000 purchase at the 2021 Manitoba CTHS Yearling Sale and looks like she has a bright future as the leading earner among Manitoba-breds in 2023!

Private Frank (\$46,077)

Private Frank won four of his seven starts and \$46,077 in 2023 for trainer Tom Gardipy, Jr. and owner-breeders Jerry Lambert and Lynn Mathews. The 3-year-old gelding by Going Commando-Inspeightofsuccess by Speightstown put together an exceptional four-race winning streak over the summer that included a win in the \$40,000 Frank Arnason Memorial Sire Stakes. And he was only bid up to \$1,000 at the 2021 Manitoba CTHS Yearling Sale before being bought back by his owners!

Melisandre (\$46,049)

Former local champion Melisandre won two of her six starts in 2023 including the \$25,000 Cool Excellence Overnight Stakes and the \$40,000 Distaff Stakes. She also finished second in the \$50,000 La Verendrye Stakes and the \$50,000 Canada Stakes. Trained by Lise Pruitt for True North Thoroughbreds and Arnason Farms, the 5-year-old mare by Going Commando-High Pioneer by Pioneering was bred by Cam Ziprick, Charles Fouillard and Barry Arnason, and ran some of the best races of her career in 2023, improving her lifetime record to 10-5-1 from 20 starts for earnings of \$172,228.

Russian Pearl (\$43,057)

One of the hardest trying horses on the grounds in 2023, Russian Pearl won two of her nine starts in 2023 including the \$40,000 R. C. Anderson Memorial Stakes. She also counted a runner up finish in the \$40,000 Hazel Wright Sire Stakes among four second-place finishes. Trained by Devon Gittens for owners Larry Falloon and Ron Wiley, the 3-year-old filly by Nonios-Russian Jewel by Wildcat Heir was bred by Falloon and partner Denis Huberdeau and sold for the bargain price of \$1,000 at the 2021 Manitoba CTHS Yearling Sale.

Justlemmeatem (\$42,407)

Like his stablemate Russian Pearl, Justlemmeatem gave it everything he had in every race in 2023, winning two of his five starts including the \$40,000 CTHS Sales Stakes, and finishing second in the \$50,000 Osiris Stakes and the \$50,000 Winnipeg Futurity. Trained by Devon Gittens for owner-breeder Dr. Betty Hughes, the 2-year-old gelding by Vengeful Wildcat-Siphon Vice by Siphon was bid up to only \$3,500 in the 2022 Manitoba CTHS Yearling Sale before being bought back by his owner, and proved to be yet another in a long list of bargains purchased at the local yearling sale.

Top NFL Picks by TravyFootball: Week 5

Texans over Falcons (Sunday noon): Don't look now, but the Houston Texans might actually be a decent football team! Sitting at 2-2 and in a four-way tie with the other three teams in the AFC south, the Texans put a beatdown on the Pittsburgh Steelers in very convincing fashion. Rookie QB CJ Stroud, who is only the third player in history with at least 900 passing yards in his first three games, has gained the confidence of Houston fans, and more importantly, his teammates, and has yet to throw an interception. If



he can continue to limit his turnovers, the Texans might have a chance to win the division and clinch a playoff spot. The Falcons are doing exactly what I said they would do a couple weeks back. They would get off to a hot start (2-0), and then come crashing back down to earth because they don't have a suitable quarterback. There are already rumblings about making a switch, and they could put in backup Taylor Heinicke to try and jumpstart the offense. Falcons coach Arthur Smith says they are sticking with Desmond Ridder, but if I have learned one thing about NFL coaches, it's that when they say they're sticking to a quarterback despite his struggles, that usually means a change is coming.

Broncos over Jets (Sunday afternoon): Well, this game meant a whole lot more at the beginning of the season as opposed to what it means now. In an alternate universe, Aaron Rodgers and former Broncos head coach Nate Hackett (now the Jets OC) would be leading the 4-0 Jets into Denver to take on the resurgent Broncos under new head coach Sean Payton. But in reality, this will be a matchup of two teams with a combined record of


2-6. Jets incumbent QB Zach Wilson played what was easily his best game of the season against the Chiefs last Sunday night. He didn't get the win and still had his terrible moments (fumbled a snap near the end of the game) but, you have to take the small victories when you can. The Broncos came back from being down 28-7, albeit against the Chicago Bears, but a win is a win. This game will be ugly, and expect the defenses to shine.

49ers over Cowboys (Sunday night): I'm sure Dallas Cowboys fans have had this game circled on their calendars for a while now. The last time these two teams got together was in the NFC divisional playoff round last year. The lasting image of Ezekiel Elliott getting bulldozed on the last play of the game will forever bring me joy, but enough about the past. My 49ers are one of two teams that are still undefeated this year (the other being the Eagles) and have dominated each one of their opponents by scoring at least 30 points in all four of their games. Brock Purdy has yet to lose a regular season game since taking over the starting job at the end of last season, and has put to rest any doubt about his abilities to lead this high powered offensive team. I shouldn't say EVERYONE believes Purdy is the real deal, there's one stubborn Cowboys fan that I know who still thinks Purdy has been extremely lucky. I won't use REAL names, so let's just call him "Boger Mones", but after Sunday night, he too will think Brock is "Purdy" good.




A Snapshot in Time

We're on a real roll with our memories of Gold Cup winners past, so let's look at a few more. In 2008 Larry Carter's stakes winner Monsoon Rain was a one-horse wonder. In addition to winning the Gold Cup, he accomplished the remarkable feat of winning the Wheat City Stakes and the R.J. Speers Memorial in the same year for trainer Martin Drexler and jockey Carlos Marquez. Larry and wife Sue lost Monsoon in 2014 and offered

Grade 1 test for 2-year-olds is a Breeders' Cup "Win and You're In" stakes

Making his debut on Aug. 25 at Saratoga, Fierceness produced an electrifying 11 1/4-length victory for trainer Todd Pletcher while covering six furlongs in a speedy 1:09.52. Now, six weeks later, Fierceness receives a major class test on Saturday, Oct. 7 in the \$500,000 Champagne Stakes (G1) for 2-year-olds at **Belmont at the Big A**, a Breeders' Cup Challenge series race that will award the winner a guaranteed, fees-paid spot in the Nov. 3 BC Juvenile (G1). 
