



Assiniboia Downs Class Showing Up Everywhere

Jeff Fa Fa, Tiger Dad, Whitehall, Escape Clause, Danelson making their marks



Assiniboia Downs class is making its presence felt across North America, and the world may be next!

Four-time ASD winner Jeff Fa Fa takes on eight tough rivals in Friday's \$200,000 Bold Ruler Stakes (G3) at Belmont at The Big A; Free Press Stakes winner Tiger Dad recently won at Keeneland; leading ASD rider Antonio Whitehall won a stakes last week at Century Downs; all-time leading ASD trainer Gary Danelson has been named to the Montana Cowboy Hall of Fame; and the first foal from the best Manitoba-bred in history, Escape Clause, is slated to make his first start on Saturday in Japan.

Whew! That's a lot of purple velvet!

Jeff Fa Fa won four races at ASD this summer and finished the season on a three-race winning streak for trainer Wendy Anderson. He then ventured to Century Downs in Alberta and set a new track-record winning the \$50,000 Red Diamond Express Handicap on September 16. Transferred to former ASD trainer Rob Atras in New York, Jeff Fa Fa has been listed at 20-1 for the Bold Ruler Stakes, which goes as the 8th race on Friday at Belmont at The Big A. He'll be making a big jump up in class, but he's at the top of his game right now.

"Pierre (owner-breeder Pierre Esquirol) called me up out of the blue to see if I'd take this horse and give it a shot – why not," said Atras in an NYRA Press <u>interview posted on PastTheWire.com</u>. "He's won four in a row and broke the track record last out at Century. If he's not at this level we can find a different spot for him, but Pierre wanted to give him a shot at the top level in New York."

Go get 'em Jeff!

Tiger Dad has already carried his winning ASD form south of the border, so maybe Jeff Fa Fa can do the same. Trained by top North American trainer Robertino Diodoro, Tiger Dad won the Free Press Stakes and finished second in the R. J. Speers Memorial this summer at the Downs before venturing to Del Mar and then on to Keeneland, where he won a \$20,000 claiming race on October 13 in game fashion.

2023 ASD leading rider Antonio Whitehall moved his tack to Alberta this fall after winning his third local riding title with 56 wins and has continued his winning ways at Century Downs, highlighted by a recent victory in the \$50,000 Birdcatcher Stakes on October 22 aboard Grated Coconut for top trainer Craig Smith. Whitehall currently sits in a tie for third in the standings at Century Downs with 11 wins, and is only five victories behind leader Dane Nelson as they head into the final weekend of racing.

On the breeding and racing front, Ivan Bigg reports that Shonan Gachi, the first foal out of Manitoba-bred superstar mare and Sovereign Award winner Escape Clause, is slated to make his debut in the fifth race this Sunday at Tokyo Racecourse in Japan. The bay colt by Japanese Derby (G1) winner Duramente sold for almost a million dollars in the 2021 Japanese Select Sale. Escape Clause (Going Commando-Danger Pay by Circulating), was bred in Manitoba by Cam Ziprick and Arnason Farms and went on to win numerous stakes including the La Canada (G3) at Santa Anita, earning \$866,100 US from a record of 20-5-4 in 35 starts. On pedigree alone...

Shonan Gachi should be a runner!

Congratulations are in order for all-time ASD leading trainer Gary Danelson. Track historian Bob Gates reports that Danelson has been chosen for induction into the Montana Cowboy Hall of Fame as part of their class of 2024. The 86-year-old master horseman from Scobey, Montana has been one of the elite trainers at Assiniboia Downs since he first arrived here in 1959, and has trained numerous stakes winners and champions at the Downs including Electric Fever, Smoky Cinder, Hi Lord, Baladi, Smart Figure, Tadaa, and Fancy Bru among others.

Danelson won his 1,250th race at the Downs in his final start of the 2023 season with Kate's Princess on September 12, improving his overall career record to 1288-1095-959 from 6,501 starts for purse earnings of \$5,931,023 US.

Top NFL Picks by TravyFootball: Week 8

49ers over Bengals (Sunday afternoon): I'm kinda glad I didn't end up going to Minneapolis last week to watch the Niners play, because that would have been a long drive just to see them get their butts kicked. But they don't have time to sit around and mope because the suddenly resurgent Cincinnati Bengals are coming into town fresh off

their bye week. San Fran REALLY needs to figure out their defense because for two weeks in a row, they have been bullied around by the opposing team and haven't generated any sort of pass rush. New defensive coordinator Steve Wilks, who replaced the outgoing DeMeco Ryans, is coming under fire for his play-calling during the game, more specifically, calling an all-out blitz right before halftime that led to a Vikings touchdown. Now, before we hit the panic button on San Fran, they did lose weeks six and seven last year. But if they couldn't slow down Kirk Cousins and Jordan Addison, I don't know how they will stop Joe Burrow and J'Marr Chase. But football is a funny thing, one week you can look like the best team in the league,



the next week you can look completely different. Maybe being back home after two road games is just the medicine they need to get back to their winning ways.

Titans over Falcons (Sunday noon): I don't know how the Falcons won last week considering how bad their quarterback played, but you take the wins when you can get them. The leash on Desmond Ridder has to be getting shorter and shorter. Two weeks ago, he threw three interceptions, last week he fumbled three times (all inside the red zone) and yet, they are in first place in their division, although it's the worst division in football right now. The Titans want to get back in the win column coming off their bye week, but that might be hard if they can't get some decent play out of the QB position. Ryan Tannehill most likely won't be in the lineup so that leaves incumbent second year quarterback Malik Willis, and rookie quarterback Will Levis, to get this ship turned in the right direction. I expect a healthy dose of Derek Henry to help out whichever young signal caller gets the start (assuming he doesn't get traded by the time readers see this).

Colts over Saints (Sunday noon): The Saints acquisition of Derek Carr in the off season was supposed to take the team to the next level and make them overwhelming favourites to win the NFC North. Instead, the Saints sit third in the division and have really struggled to find any sort of rhythm or consistency on offense. Carr only has six touchdown passes on the season, that's less than one a game. This might be one of the reasons the Raiders were so willing to let him go (although they're having their own QB issues now). Even with Alvin Kamara back from suspension, they still seem to be settling for field goals instead of getting touchdowns. The Colts found themselves in an unexpected shootout last week against the Browns, and if it wasn't for a questionable penalty at the end of the game, they very well could have won. With rookie QB Anthony Richardson done for the season, backup Gardner Minshew has been serviceable in his place. He still will make some boneheaded plays (like fumbling in the endzone) but he definitely has no problems moving the offense up and down the field and scoring points, pretty much the opposite of what the Saints do.

"I Won Bigg" Wagering Group



Breeders' Cup Pre-entries Strong, 18 in BC Classic

Large international contingent, O'Brien leads all trainers with 13

Led by four winners from a year ago and a large international contingent, a total of 205 horses were pre-entered for this year's Breeders' Cup, which takes place on Nov. 3-4 at Santa Anita. The 205 figure matches that of last year and represents the second-most pre-entries for the Breeders' Cup behind only the 221 that were pre-entered in 2018. International representation is strong, with 43 European-based runners pre-entered along with nine Japanese-based horses and one from Argentina. More from the *Daily Racing Form* here.


