A look back at some of the best conditioning jobs of 2023 at ASD

There were some excellent conditioning jobs orchestrated by some of the best trainers at Assiniboia Downs in 2023, all marked by consistency, quality and a will to win.

Trainer Jerry Gourneau not only won his record fourth consecutive training title and fifth overall, he also won his first Manitoba Derby with Henry S. Witt, Jr.'s Mano Dura. The Manitoba Derby is the toughest race to win at Assiniboia Downs, and you have to have your horse peaking at just the right time to do so.

Claimed on June 17 for \$50,000 at Lone Star Park in Texas, Gourneau was only able to get one prep into Mano Dura before the Derby and he came with a long resolute drive to win it on July 24. Two weeks later with leading rider Antonio Whitehall up, Gourneau had Mano Dura primed perfectly and his 3-year-old Keen Ice colt drew away to win by 4 1/4-lengths.

Nicely done!

Next up we have Magic Tiger and trainer Wendy Anderson. Claimed for just \$6,250 at Golden Gate on April 2 for Bill Meikle and Wind Dancer Stable, Anderson managed her new horse perfectly at Assiniboia Downs and saved his best for last.

Magic Tiger won his first two starts locally in allowance races before finishing a fast closing third beaten a neck in the Free Press Stakes. The 5-year-old Smiling Tiger gelding then won the R. J. Speers and finished an odd fourth in the Manitoba Mile before rebounding to win both the Bocage Overnight Stakes and the Gold Cup. Magic Tiger won five of seven starts at the Downs with Damario Bynoe in the saddle and earned over \$100,000 for Anderson and her partners.

A grand return on investment!

Murray Duncan winning stakes with a former claimer is par for the course in these parts, and he did more of the same in 2023 with Burrow Down. Claimed for \$30,000 on May 8, 2022, for owner Gerald Babchishin, Burrow Down won all three of her starts at the Downs in 2022 before heading west and then south without winning, but she returned to best form once back in Manitoba with Duncan.

The 4-year-old Connect filly won four of her five starts at the Downs in 2023 including the La Verendrye Stakes, the Canada Day Stakes, the Miss Sandy Dee Overnight Stakes and capped off a superb year with a dig-in win in the Manitoba Matron Stakes in the final week of live racing. Ridden by Stanley Chadee, Jr. Burrow Down is now 7-for-8 at Assiniboia Downs with earnings of over \$180,000.



We also have to add an honourable mention for trainer Marvin Buffalo and Spitten Kitten. Owned by Marvin, his wife Debbie and Arnold Souster, Spitten Kitten was picked out by Debbie and purchased as a yearling for \$2,500. The 3-year-old filly by Air Force Blue broke her maiden at Assiniboia Downs last year and finished fifth in the Osiris Stakes before heading to Phoenix to grow up and develop in the sun. It worked.

Spitten Kitten won an allowance race March 18 at Turf Paradise and then went on a three-race win spree here, winning the One and Only Overnight Stakes, the Chantilly Stakes and the Jack Hardy Stakes in rocket-romping fashion under Sven Balroop before being put away for a rest as yet another bargain who earned over \$100,000 at Assiniboia Downs.

Great development job.

Finally we have trainer Devon Gittens and Canyouhearmerunnin, the best 2-year-old on the grounds at ASD in 2023. Gittens continues to excel with young horses and Canyouhearmerunnin fit into his program beautifully, winning all four of his starts under jockey Shavon Belle.

Owned by Pink Cloud Racing and Ron Wiley, the 2-year-old gelding by Reload won the Graduation and Osiris Stakes and capped off a perfect season with a victory in the 94th running of the Winnipeg Futurity on the second last day of the meeting. Purchased for less than \$5,000 as a yearling, Canyouhearmerunnin earned over \$100,000 at Assiniboia Downs in 2023. Amazing.

Top NFL Picks by TravyFootball: Week 4

Jags over Falcons (Sunday morning from London): The Jags will head overseas for back-to-back games in their home away from home, London, England. First up, the Atlanta Falcons. I'm not sure what's up with the Jags so far this season, but they definitely don't look like the playoff team from a year ago that almost knocked out the Chiefs. Trevor Lawrence only has three touchdowns to go with two interceptions through three games, and that's WITH the big off-season addition of wide receiver Calvin Ridley, who coincidentally,



was acquired from the Atlanta Falcons. The Desmond Ridder led offense of Atlanta was brought back down to earth last week, only managing to score three points against the Detroit Lions.

Bills over Dolphin (Sunday noon): In my 35 years of watching football, never have I seen a team put up 70 points in a regular NFL game. The Miami Dolphins absolutely pummeled the Denver Broncos last week 70-20. It was the most points scored in a game since 1966, and if it wasn't for the coach letting up and taking out the starters, they probably could have scored 80 or more. Running backs Raheem Mostert and rookie speedster De'Von Achane had four touchdowns EACH and probably won a lot of fantasy football players their week. I will eat a little bit of humble crow as I picked the Commanders to upset the Bills last week, and boy was I wrong. It wasn't quite 70-20, but 37-3 isn't bad either. The Bills defense dominated and tallied nine sacks, four interceptions, and a pick-6. Now these division rivals will clash in what is sure to be the game of the week.


Vikings over Panthers (Sunday noon): In one of the "Toilet Bowl" games of the week (the other one being Broncos vs Bears.. yuck), Kirk (I make bad throws at the worst possible time) Cousins will face off against either Andy Dalton, or Bryce Young if he's healthy enough to play. The Vikings had every opportunity to win their game last week against the Chargers, but due to some very poor clock management at the end, and a very bad interception, they lost yet another one score game. 


