



Mott Conjures Up Breeders' Cup Memories

Hall of Fame Trainer wins three Breeders' Cup races 28 years after Cigar's Classic

In 1989 I was visiting Allen Jerkens at Saratoga and sitting on a bench talking to an old groom. He said there were only two trainers everybody wanted to work for – Jerkens and Bill Mott.

Jerkens was widely regarded as one of the <u>best trainers in the history of thoroughbred</u> <u>racing</u> before he passed away in 2015, and still is. He was also the youngest trainer ever inducted into the <u>Hall of Fame</u> at the age of 45 in 1975, and I was lucky enough to work for him in 1983. <u>Mott joined Jerkens in the Hall of Fame</u> in 1998, also at the age of 45.

Jerkens orchestrated more upsets of champions (<u>he beat Secretariat twice</u>) than any other trainer in the history of the sport. Mott trained the mighty Cigar to tie the modern-day record of <u>16 victories in a row</u> (held by Citation), including the 1995 Breeders' Cup Classic at Belmont Park.

The quality of horsemanship evidenced in these barns is elite, and has stood the test of time. Stricter medication rules have all but pushed the 40-percent trainers out of the game, something that has been welcomed by horse people across the nation. The medication rules for the Breeders' Cup are even stricter, and have acted to keep the fakers at bay. Trainers that win Breeders' Cup races now are the real thing.

So it was no surprise to see Mott win three Breeders' Cup races last weekend, or European trainer Aidan O'Brien win a pair. Both trainers have consistently defeated the best of their generation, and rank in the top five among all Breeders' Cup trainers with 15 wins each.

Mott, who hails from South Dakota and who also spent some time at Assiniboia Downs during his formative years, won the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies on Friday with Just F Y I, and followed up on Saturday with wins in the Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile with Cody's Wish, and the Breeders' Cup Sprint with Elite Power. O'Brien won the Breeders' Cup Juvenile

Turf with Unquestionable on Friday and the Breeders' Cup Turf with Auguste Rodin on Saturday.

If you're a handicapper, that's five winners in 14 Breeders' Cup races. Both trainers were must-includes in any race they had a horse in, without handicapping.

I was lucky enough to spend time with Mott covering Cigar for the Thoroughbred Times at the 1995 Breeders' Cup in New York. Standing in the pouring rain outside his barn the morning before the Breeders' Cup Classic, the backstretch was flooded and I was the only reporter who showed up. Mott said he wasn't supposed to allow anyone in the barn, but he couldn't stand to see me standing outside in the rain and invited me in to meet and pat Cigar. As a horse lover with a soft spot for class and heart, it was a moment I'll cherish forever.

On the morning of the Classic, Cigar, Mott on his pony, and myself, went to the track together shrouded in a lonely gray mist. The track was sloppy, and Cigar had never run in the mud. All of us wanted to know what he would think of it. When Cigar got to the track and Mott turned him loose from the pony, we got our answer. Cigar reared up and exploded like he was the second-coming of Pegasus.

Later that afternoon, Cigar won the Breeders' Cup Classic, capping off <u>a perfect 10-for-10 season</u>. His owner Allen Paulson and I were the first to step on the track after Cigar passed the wire. We stood beside each other marvelling at what we had just witnessed, and Paulson turned to me and said, "He's something else, isn't he."

He was.

After the race, I went back to the Mott barn hoping to get a print of Cigar signed. The barn was empty and Mott was nowhere in sight, but a little exploring led me behind the barn, where I found Mott with his whole crew, along with owners Allen Paulson and his wife Madeleine, casually celebrating on bales of hay having a beer. They invited me to join them and treated me as part of the team. Everyone signed my print, including the owner, trainer, assistant trainers, groom, exercise rider, and jockey Jerry Bailey, making it the only print of its kind in the world.

They say horses often mirror their trainers, and respond in kind. Nothing could have been closer to the truth in the case of Cigar and Bill Mott. Twenty-eight years later, his horses continue to perform to his personality.

Top NFL Picks by TravyFootball: Week 10

Lions over Chargers (Sunday afternoon): The Chargers laid quite the beat down on the Jets last Monday night and dominated in every phase of the game. A much tougher task is ahead this week when the Detroit Lions come to town fresh off their bye. On paper it says it's a home game for the Chargers, but everybody knows that people living in the Los Angeles area couldn't care less about the two teams they have. I can almost guarantee that there will be more Lions fans at this game then there will be Chargers fans. Lions rookie running back Jahmyr Gibbs had 152 yards rushing and a touchdown in his last game and I expect him to find similar success against the Chargers. All of a sudden, the Lions



have the Vikings hot on their trail for first in the NFC North, so they can't afford any losses right now.

Niners over Jags (Sunday noon): Coming off a much needed bye week, San Francisco will look to get back into the win column after dropping three straight. The 49ers did make a move during their bye week, acquiring former second overall pick Chase Young from the Washington Commanders. The Niners already had a fearsome front four, but adding Chase Young will only make them better. The offense will get a boost when Deebo Samuel returns from the injury that kept him out the last couple of games, and Brock Purdy will be happy to have his full arsenal of weapons to work with again. Even though the Jags have the third best rushing defense in the league, they have yet to face a running back the calibre of Christian McCaffrey. McCaffrey has scored a touchdown in 17 consecutive games, and I have a feeling he's going to break the NFL record and make it 18.

Ravens over Browns (Sunday noon): Both of these teams had light work last week, winning very convincingly over the Cardinals and Seahawks, so now they will renew their division rivalry against each other. Who the "best" team in the league is seems to change on a week to week basis, but I don't think anyone is playing better than the Ravens right now. They've scored over 31 points in 3 consecutive games and have also won four games in a row. Putting up another 31 points might prove difficult as Cleveland currently owns the top defense in the league. Browns edge rusher Myles Garrett is having an MVP-like season and is tied for second in the league with 9.5 sacks. He will have his hands full trying to chase down Lamar Jackson but I'm sure he's up to the task.




