Cecelia Liebrecht Wins Again!

Hits \$98.20 cap horse at Remington Park to win Player's Choice tourney



Mor Lana Spirit (\$98.20) gets a well deserved pat after winning the fifth race at Remington Park on Saturday, effectively winning the November Player's Choice Tournament for Cecelia Liebrecht.

Cecilia Liebrecht won her second Player's Choice Tournament in November, and once again she did it with a whopping bankroll.

Liebrecht last won the Player's Choice tourney in February 2022 with a bankroll of \$149.50. This time she did it with \$149.70.

Normally you have to double your money from \$60 to \$120 to have a chance at winning. Once you get into the \$130 range you have a big shot at taking home the \$1,000 first prize. Not only did Liebrecht beat that number, she had to outfinish four other

handicappers who also blew away the \$120 marker.

Liebrecht finished \$11.80 ahead of Tanis Atras (\$137.90), followed by Scott Anderson (\$134.00), Darcy Penner (\$129.40) and Greg Earl (\$88.10). All four of the top bankrolls were good enough to win in an average contest, but of course, our local handicappers aren't average:)


Liebrecht's big winner on the day came in the fifth race at Remington Park, when 49-1 Mor Lana Spirit came barreling down the stretch to win a photo by a nose, returning \$98.20, \$28.40 \$6.70 across the board. Although payoffs are capped at \$42, \$22 and \$12, they were still enough to get the job done for Liebrecht, who also nailed 11-1 Mastermind in the ninth race at Del Mar.

Runner-up Tanis Atras hit a number of winners topped by 14-1 Flatterwithjewels in the fourth race at Del Mar, Scott Anderson hit 19-1 Scotch No Rocks in the first race at Churchill Downs, and Darcy Penner scored with two longshots including 12-1 Lena's Shadow in the third race at Remington Park and 10-1 Master Piece in the ninth at Aqueduct, the Red Smith Stakes.

Any of these longshots might have been enough to separate a handicapper from the pack in a normal tournament, but our local 'cappers came out firing. Only one of the top four finishers was in the top 10 in the standings for the Handicapper of the Year title, which will be decided next month, but they prevented any of the leaders from opening up on the pack, setting the stage for a great battle in the final tournament of the year.

Numerous players have a shot at the Handicapper of the Year title this year, which offers a \$3,500 cash prize to the winner. Glen Gray currently leads the standings with 258 points, but he's followed closely by Nicole Baker (251 points), Randy Premachuk (250), Steve Holborn (248) and Keith MacLennan (245), any of whom could take the title with a strong December performance. 2020 Handicapper of the Year Trevor Tilston-Jones is also right there in sixth place with 236 points.

Bills over Jets (Sunday afternoon): The Bills suddenly find themselves on the outside of the playoff picture after a disappointing loss to the Denver Broncos on Monday night. The first interception he threw wasn't his fault, because it went off a receiver's hand, but the second one he threw was just a bad decision. He also had another interception that was actually called back due to a penalty. His poor play cost the





Northern Dancer

A 'Pocket Battleship' Who Became a Worldwide Influence

Small and stocky, the bonny bay colt named Northern Dancer was built more like an old-style Quarter Horse than a sleek Thoroughbred. In 1962, he was offered for \$25,000 at his yearling sale. There were no takers. Two years later, in the lead-up to the Kentucky Derby the press poked fun at the colt's pint-size (15.1 hands) stature. Then Northern Dancer uncorked a jaw-dropping two-minute flat run breaking the 89-year-old track record and become the first Canadian born and bred horse to win the world's most famous race. He

Strange Superfecta and Hi-5 Wagers attract attention from regulators






Pools for Superfecta and Hi-5 wagers were larger than ever seen before at some tracks.

The wagers – which created pool sizes never before seen at some of the tracks in question – focused on superfecta and super high five wagers that require a gambler to pick the first four and first five finishers, respectively, in a race.
