Ron Phelps wins Player's Choice Tourney

Two-time Handicapper of the Year's top harness pick makes Secretariat move



Longshot Nasty Reputation (#7) made a bullet move at 32-1 to win the first race at Flamboro Downs last Saturday and propelled Ron Phelps to the top in the Player's Choice Handicapping Tournament.


The first thing that came to mind when we watched Nasty Reputation's race last Saturday was Secretariat's move in the 1973 Preakness, but this wasn't a thoroughbred, it was a standardbred. And it won two-time Handicapper of the Year Ron Phelps the Player's Choice Handicapping Tournament.

Nasty Reputation made a bullet move after half a mile in the first race at Flamboro Downs, went by most of the field like they were standing still, caught the heavily favoured leader into the final turn, dueled that one into submission by mid stretch, and held off the second choice late to win a magnifying glass photo.



Phelps followed that big winner up with 9/5 winner Sea Dancer in the seventh race at Santa Anita, and added

one more second place finish and three third place finishes to win the tourney with a bankroll of \$106.40, defeating runner-up Nicole Baker by an uncharacteristically large margin of \$20.10. Baker built her bankroll of \$86.30, followed by Chris Trubyk (\$79.40), Stan Stewin (\$79.30) and 2023 Handicapper of the Year Glen Gray (\$77.80).



"I can't remember the last time I won," said Phelps. "But it's been quite awhile. I've finished in the money, but just haven't won lately. These tournaments are not easy to win. We've got a lot of good handicappers here. If you don't get one good horse home, you don't have a hope in hell. I just got lucky on this. The amount that I ended up with, to be honest, I didn't think that that would be enough to win. I figured I'd be in top five, but I didn't think it would be enough to win."



Phelps couldn't resist playing his longshot winner when it went off as a huge overlay. "I looked at this horse and at 6-1, I figured, well, that's pretty generous," said Phelps. "He was going back to the original driver and he'd already run against the morning-line favourite. But they bet that horse down to 1-5. I looked at the program, and when my horse started going up and up and up in the odds, I thought what the hell, what am I missing here? I looked at the program again and I still liked the horse."

Nasty Reputation paid \$67.50 to win, \$29.20 to place, and an incredible \$45.70 to show when the favourite ran out of the money, and although the longshot payoffs were capped based on tournament rules, they were still enough to win Phelps the tourney.

Now retired from Manitoba Hydro, the 69-year-old has been playing the horses for over 30 years. He's also owned horses for about the same length of time.

"I've still got a horse, Wait a Sec, with Marvin and Deb (Buffalo)," said Phelps. "They went to Tampa Bay this winter. So she's run once there and we're trying to get her in another race. I've been with them a number of years now. Larry Liebrecht (also a regular tourney player) is a partner with us. They're great horse people and they're good friends as well, so I was sure glad I got hooked up with them. It was one of the best moves I ever made."

Phelps is primarily a pace and speed handicapper, and says you can use the same handicapping techniques to play both thoroughbred and standardbred racing, which he did on Saturday.

"My grandson had a hockey game in the afternoon and I wanted to watch that and then the NFL playoffs," said Phelps. "So I thought I'd just play the later tracks in the evening and just take the day off because I wanted to do all this. And then a couple tracks

canceled and there wasn't a lot to choose from. So I played a few from Santa Anita and Delta Downs and the rest on harness, and I got lucky with one."

Phelps said it had been at least three years since he won and was surprised that his bankroll was high enough.

"We have some good handicappers here," said Phelps. "And that makes it fun. Everyone thinks it's easy, but it really isn't."

Is handicapping good for the mind?

"Absolutely," said Phelps. "I mean, you've got to have something. That's why we do it. I think it's good for you. Well, at least that's what I keep telling Kathy (wife of 47 years). She plays in the tournaments too. She didn't go in the last one, but every once in a while, she beats me. And she certainly lets me know about it. You have to have something you enjoy. And I'll enjoy this until the day I die, that's for sure."

Phelps first got involved with horses through the honourary horse program, where you could be involved with a horse while not actually owning it, and learn everything about owning a racehorse.

"I had an honourary horse with Lorna (Gray), and I don't even remember what year that was," said Phelps. "That's got to be 40 years ago now, but it got me hooked. Lorna was great. The year after that, I got into horse ownership. I bought a chunk of a horse, and it all started there. So it's been a long time. We've had all kinds of wins, but every horse is different. If you can break even or make a little bit of money, everything's great. I've had a lot of pretty good years, and it didn't cost me much."

One of Phelps' favourite things about owning a horse is just going to the barns in the mornings, watching the workouts, and just being involved with the horse people.

"They're genuine people," said Phelps. "I enjoy going to the barns. Seeing the horses. Watching the workouts. I've got some physical issues now, so it's harder for me getting around. But you do what you got to do. And I still enjoy going to the backstretch and having coffee with Marvin and Deb in the mornings. And that's what it's all about as well. They're good friends, and I'm sure happy to be with them. Marvin knows his horses and we've picked out some pretty good ones."

You've got to be good to be lucky.



Top NFL Picks by TravyFootball: Conference Championships

Niners over Lions (Sunday night): Even though the Green Bay Packers outplayed San Francisco for a majority of the game last week, a masterful drive by Brock Purdy at the end led to the goahead touchdown with a minute left on the clock. Linebacker Dre Greenlaw sealed the game with an interception and sent the 49ers to the NFC Championship for the fourth time in five years. But Brock Purdy can ill afford to have another shaky game like that, or he and the rest of the team will find themselves going home instead of going to Vegas for the Super Bowl. Standing in their way, the number one seed Baltimore Ravens. Lamar Jackson didn't have the greatest first half against the Texans last week, but in the second half it was a totally different story. The Ravens ripped off 24 unanswered points and sent Houston packing. Until someone actually knocks off Mahomes, it's really hard to bet against the guy. He shows Tom Brady-like qualities when it comes to getting it done, despite not having the best weapons around him.







\$3 Million Pegasus World Cup highlight of six stakes at Gulfstream Park Saturday

The first marquee race of the 2024 North American racing calendar is coming up this Saturday, Jan. 27, as Gulfstream Park hosts the eighth edition of the \$3 million, Grade 1 Pegasus World Cup Invitational Stakes Presented by Baccarat. The Pegasus is also the anchor race of a card that features six other graded stakes races including the \$1 million, Grade 1 1/ST Bet Pegasus World Cup Turf Invitational Stakes and the \$500,000, Grade 3

Pegasus Filly and Mare Turf Invitational Stakes Presented by TAA. More from *America's Best Racing* here.
