

Kentucky Derby Preps

Four good betting races to find your Derby horse in, before they peak

The Road to the Kentucky Derby picks up momentum this weekend with four key prep races across the USA. We'll be looking for horses that do something out of the ordinary, and hoping it doesn't get noticed by the masses. We're searching for horses that will peak on the first Saturday in May, preferably at long odds, while at the same time trying to cash a few tickets along the way.

At Gulfstream Park in Florida the Grade 3 Holy Bull Stakes has drawn a competitive field of eight 3-year-olds going 1 1/16-miles. Fierceness, winner of the Breeders' Cup Juvenile last year, returns as the 3/5 heavy favourite off a layoff but faces some tough challengers including Otello and Hades. Will he be fit enough, mentally and physically?

Out west at Santa Anita, the Grade 3 Robert Lewis Stakes will be run at a mile. Undefeated Nysos looms large for trainer Bob Baffert, having won his first two starts by a combined 19 1/4 lengths. However, he faces his first test around two turns against eight rivals including multiple graded stakes-placed Stronghold.

Down south at Oaklawn Park, a full field of twelve will line up for the Grade 3 Southwest Stakes at 1 1/16- miles. The Steve Asmussen duo of Carbone and Otto The Conqueror have home field advantage, but Street Sense Stakes winner Liberal Arts and Los Alamitos Futurity winner Wynstock appear dangerous.

Finally, at Aqueduct in New York, nine 3-year-olds are entered in the historic Grade 3 Withers Stakes at 1 1/8-miles. El Grande O and Lightline are the morning line favourites, but longshots like Society Man and Uncle Heavy have some people watching the odds.

With big fields and promising contenders, this weekend's Kentucky Derby preps offer plenty of wagering value, while at the same time offering the opportunity to spot improving sophomores as they roll towards the Run for the Roses on Saturday, May 4.

Watch closely.

Sincere Condolences: David Blake

Longtime horse owner and Handicapper of the Year loses his battle with cancer

Assiniboia Downs is sad to announce that former horse owner and Handicapper of the Year David Blake passed away earlier this week after a long battle with cancer.

Local fans and friends of David would probably remember his top horse Jaya Ho, who won 10 races for him at Assiniboia Downs and Turf Paradise.

"She was a pretty good horse," said Blake in an earlier interview with The Inside Track after he won last September's Las Vegas Handicapping Challenge. "She paid her way. We

ended up breeding her to Upper Mesa Falls and she's got a little baby that's going to hopefully race next year at the Downs."

The 2019 Handicapper of the Year had many friends in the backstretch, and he was a big supporter of Assiniboia Downs. He simply loved the sport of horse racing, and his horses.

The last time we spoke with David, he said that being able to play in the local handicapping contests helped him to keep his spirits up, while facing the toughest fight of his life.

"Every time I get up, it just doesn't work out," he said. "The racing keeps me going. I just love the races, as you know. I didn't own any horses this year, but I've kind of lived vicariously through Randy Premachuk and Steve Holborn there. They keep in touch with me all the time."

Doctors had given David less than a year to live in September, unless he could get into one of the experimental trials at Princess Margaret Hospital in Toronto.

"Thank God I have people going to bat for me," he said at the time. "I'm just taking it day by day here. Let's hope for the best. Hopefully they can come up with something and extend my life for a little bit longer. I just hope I get a little more time on this earth, but I guess somebody upstairs will decide that for me and we'll see what happens"

"I can't express enough how thankful I am for everyone's love, prayers and financial support for me," wrote David on a GoFundMe page that was set up to help pay for his medication. "It truly is overwhelming. I hope all is well with everyone."

David truly appreciated all the messages of encouragement he received from his friends at Assiniboia Downs, and said they truly helped keep him going.

No obituary was available at the time of this writing, but we will update everyone here as more details come in.

Our sincerest condolences to David's family and many friends.



Top NFL Picks by TravyFootball: Conference Championship Recap

Niners defeat Lions 34-31: For the second straight week, the 49ers decided to make it much more difficult than it needed to be, while also wreaking havoc with my emotions. It wasn't looking too great when Detroit jumped out to an early 14-0 lead. The Niners finally answered back with a Christian McCaffrey TD to cut the lead in half, only for the Lions to March right back down the field for another score to make it 21-7, and that's where all the controversy began.



Lions coach Dan Campbell has been notorious for leaving the kicking team on the sidelines when it comes to 4th and short situations, so it left many people scratching their heads as to why he kicked a field goal to end the half. Instead of possibly being ahead 28-7, which would've put a nail in the Niners coffin, it was 24-7, which still seemed pretty insurmountable to come back from. But, with their backs against the wall, the Niners scored 27 points in a row capped off with an incredible "off the defenders facemask pop up in the air" catch by Brandon Aiyuk. When all was said and done, Brock Purdy, in only his second year in the league, took one final knee down that sent him and the 49ers to the Super Bowl. Many people were questioning Dan Campbell's decision, after the fact, and the simple answer to that is, it's what they did all season, so why would they change it now.

Chiefs defeat Ravens 17-10: This game started out like it was going to be a shoot out with each team exchanging touchdowns right off the bat. The Chiefs went into halftime with a 17-7 lead, and that was basically it in terms of scoring for the rest of the game other than a late field goal in the fourth quarter by the Ravens. Once again Lamar Jackson failed to advance to the Super Bowl, and that will only reinforce what people had been saying about him beforehand. Yes, he has won an MVP in the past, and he will probably win MVP this year as well, but when it comes to playoff expectations, he always falls flat. He did not play very well against Kansas City. Part of it was his fault, part of it was the game plan that the Ravens decided to go with.

All season long the strength of this team has been the running game, and for whatever reason they decided to change it up and almost completely abandon it against the Chiefs. They only had 15 rushing attempts, which was well below their team average per game of 30. They did have a chance to cut the Chiefs lead down to three points, but a boneheaded play by Ravens receiver Zay Flowers, in which he dove into the endzone and was stripped of the ball before crossing the line, resulted in a touchback instead of a touchdown. You can't really say enough about Pat Mahomes. This is probably the weakest Kansas City team that he's played on, but he still managed to lead them to another Super Bowl appearance.





February, thought by some to be the longest shortest month of the year, is loaded with goodies: Groundhog Day, the bonspiel thaw, and Leap Year, so let's continue with our look of milestones past. Thirty years ago, on July 16, 1994, Bruce Tully's Ranger's Wish bested a field of mid-level claimers. Bruce always said that his bay gelding was one of the best horses to ever look through a bridle. Ranger recorded 26 wins from 93 lifetime starts with his finest year coming in 1996, when he notched 8 wins, a second and a third in 11 outings at the Downs. Hades Could Upset Holy Bull

Bettors must consider whether favoured Fireceness will be ready

This Saturday's \$250,000 Holy Bull Stakes (G3) kicks off the Road to the Florida Derby series and offers the winner 20 points on the Road to the Kentucky Derby. Fierceness leads all 3-year-olds at this stage in the season, having amassed 30 points with his six-

length win last November in the Breeders' Cup Juvenile (G1), and bettors will likely expect him to pick up where he left off. One thing they'll have to consider however, is the question of intent, as well as physical fitness after three months off compared to others who have run much more recently. <u>Undefeated Nysos a Short-Priced Favourite in Robert B. Lewis</u>

Trainer Bob Baffert looking for record 12th victory in the race

Longshot Liberal Arts could get just the right setup at Oaklawn Park

A week later than expected, Oaklawn Park's rescheduled \$800,000 Southwest Stakes (G3) will be run this Saturday with another large field. A field of 12 was drawn for the 1 1/16-mile test that offers 42 qualifying points for the 2024 Kentucky Derby. Longshot Liberal Arts (8-1) has not raced since winning the Street Sense at Churchill Downs in October, but he does have a a win at the distance and he should get a lively pace to chase. Withers Stakes Analysis

Speedy El Grande O faces more quick rivals than he faced in the Jerome

Saturday's \$200,000 Withers (G3) is the fourth of six stops on the Aqueduct road to the Kentucky Derby 2024, and 20-10-6-4-2 qualifying points are available to the top five eligible finishers. New York-bred El Grande O is the top earner and most experienced horse in the field with nine starts, including a pair of victories in New York-bred stakes races with front-end efforts. In his last race he set the pace and finished second in the Jerome Stakes. He'll likely use the same tactics again this Saturday, but he'll be facing more speed this time. Spirit Animal is Out of This World \$10,000 claim is on a roll for former ASD trainer Martin Drexler


